



We're all in this together: A Unique Approach to Interprofessional Education on Labor & Delivery

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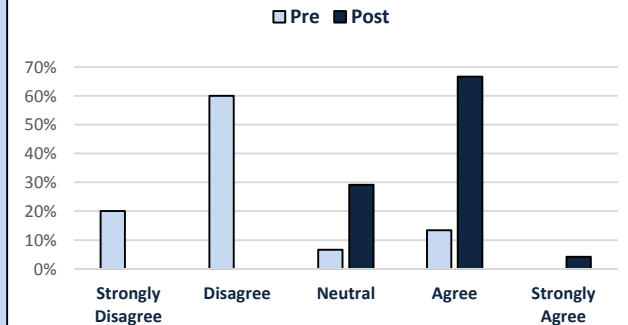

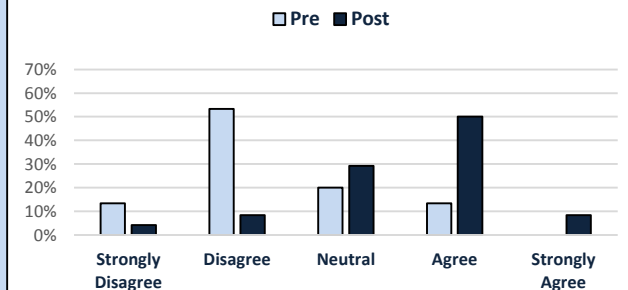
"I feel empowered to call for help if there is an emergency and I feel like my concept of who is on the team is much larger than prior to the simulation."
